*Rakhshee joined The C.A.S. School four years after it was established in 1981. Since then, spreading over a period of almost four decades, she had been the driving force behind the creative spirit and ethos of the C.A.S. She played a pivotal role in shaping many of our school activities, including our publications, The Centreline, The Golden Pen, and Stroberies and Peechs. She was the moving spirit behind our Music Programme, in particular being responsible for the Evening of Rhythm and Rhyme which has become an integral part of our school culture. In addition to her contribution to the C.A.S., she was a founding member of and Editor at the Bookgroup, an NGO and sister organisation of the C.A.S. which publishes Urdu and English books for small children. She herself authored, co-authored and edited many of these books.*

*In recognition of her contribution to the C.A.S., the school has instituted the Rakhshee Niazi Gold Medal. The recipient of the award for the Class of 2025 was Awais Rajesh.*







## German language camps

### Youth Camp in Germany

Muhammad Mujtaba Ali Khan and Naiel Ahmed Danish of Class 10 attended the Goethe-Institut's Youth Language Camp in Cologne (Köln), Germany, from 30 June to 20 July 2024. The intensive course comprised daily lessons, each spanning two to three teaching blocks, focusing on reading, comprehension, writing, and speaking. Our German Language teacher, Mr Irfan Khan accompanied the students and attended the teachers' training programme in Dresden while the students were involved at their camp.

### Youth Camp in Sri Lanka

Rayyan Ahmad Rasheed of Class 11 and Hafsa Abdul Rahim of Class 10 attended the regional youth camp in Sri Lanka, from 23 to 27 September 2024. The camp took place in Negombo, a coastal town 37 kilometres north of Colombo, renowned for its vibrant fish market, stunning sandy beaches and historic Dutch fortress. Participants also had the opportunity to enjoy water sports and boat trips in the nearby lagoons and canals.

### Youth Camp in Pakistan

Shan Ali and Muhammad Shaheer Faisal of Class 10 took part in a local youth camp held in the scenic Thandiani region of Pakistan from 10 to 13 October 2024 organised by the Goethe-Institut Pakistan. ## Seminar: *Introduction to Journalism*

The seminar *Introduction to Journalism*, led by Ms Irum Kazmi, provides an invaluable opportunity for students to develop essential skills in investigative reporting and article writing, while upholding the principles of ethical journalism.

In today's digital era, where propaganda and fake news often take precedence across various platforms, media ethics has become a vital component of the seminar, guiding students through the complexities of truthful and accurate reporting. Furthermore, through engaging in class discussions and undertaking practical assignments, such as creating public service

message videos, students gain a comprehensive understanding of the field of journalism. This knowledge equips them to make meaningful contributions to shaping society and enriching their communities.

Ms Kazmi's dedication and unwavering passion are instrumental in creating an interactive and engaging classroom environment. Participants emerge with a broader, more open-minded perspective of the world, coupled with an enhanced ability to think objectively. It is not merely an educational experience but a profoundly liberating one as well.



## Seminar: *GRAMA-Journalism Competition*

From 26 to 28 September, students of Class 11 participated in GRAMA, a journalism competition hosted by Karachi Grammar School.

The C.A.S. School competed against several other schools and colleges, showcasing their skills across a variety of challenging modules, including 'Advert Saga', 'Scavenger Hunt' and 'Directors Cut'. Each module focused on a specific aspect of journalism, ranging from the adventures of investigative reporting to the biases inherent in global newspapers. Students were tasked with submitting various assignments, including video presentations, essays and photojournalism projects. Many of these had to be completed within

tight deadlines during designated hours on campus. Students demonstrated resilience and adaptability, successfully navigating unforeseen challenges with composure. Despite facing fierce competition, particularly from A-level schools, the C.A.S. teams achieved commendable results: securing first place in two modules, second place in one and earning an 'Honourable Mention' in three others.

Congratulations to the teams for their performance. This remarkable achievement was made possible through the dedicated guidance and support of Ms Irum Kazmi.



## Seminar: *Interfaith Dialogue*

The *Interfaith Dialogue* seminar, led by its instructor Ms Jacqueline Mirza, is an intellectually stimulating programme in which students explore themes such as the role of religion in society, shared values, common ethical principles and how interfaith understanding can foster peace and harmony. Through interactive and reflective sessions, combined with video analysis, the seminar creates an environment where individuals can challenge stereotypes and dispel misconceptions by engaging in open, candid and respectful discussions.

Ms Mirza tailors her teaching approach by incorporating feedback and adapting the course material to align with students' interests, ensuring a personalised and enriching learning journey.

The aim is to broaden understanding, create mutual respect, cooperation and shared responsibility in a world often characterised by religious and cultural divides. Additionally, field trips to places of worship provide direct exposure to diverse religious traditions, making it a transformative and unforgettable experience.



## Seminar: *Introduction to Philosophy*

Instructor **Zohaib Zuby**

The seminar on *Introduction to Philosophy*, led by Mr Zohaib Zuby, invites participants to engage in fundamental questions surrounding existence, knowledge, ethics and the nature of reality. Topics span a wide range, from the essence of justice to the complex implications of free will. Through the critical analysis of texts by influential philosophers and rigorous classroom discussions, students learn to formulate and explain their viewpoints. In this setting, open dialogue enables them to challenge one

another's ideas, creating a safe space for thoughtful debate and self-expression while also cultivating empathy by encouraging respect for differing beliefs.

Those who choose this seminar are likely to graduate with a transformed perspective on the world. Through a journey of intellectual growth and self-discovery, they acquire the skills to challenge assumptions and approach life with greater thoughtfulness and deeper analysis.



## Seminar: *Appreciation of Art*

As part of the Class 11 curriculum, the *Appreciation of Art* seminar has established itself as a valuable addition, offering an extensive exploration of diverse art and design genre and techniques. This year's seminar began with a focus on illustration, where participants engaged in activities such as designing original characters.

This was followed by an introduction to the art of animation, where drawings were brought to life through the application of technology.

In the second term, the seminar delved into textile design and provided sessions on sculpture. However, the highlight for many was the puppetry module, which involved crafting puppets from scratch.

Each segment was facilitated by art educators and practising artists from prominent institutions, including the Indus Valley School of Art and Architecture, Karachi University's Visual Studies Department and the Institute of Business Administration.



## Seminar: *International Relations*

Instructor **Umer Irfan Sharfuddin**

The seminar on *International Relations*, led by Mr Umer Irfan Sharfuddin, offers an insight into the complexities of global affairs and diplomacy. This course covers a wide range of topics, including the dynamics of international political relationships, geographical influences and the underlying causes of global conflicts such as poverty, inequality, corporate greed and hegemonic policies of world powers.

Each session encourages participants to critically engage with world events, political agendas and controversial issues. They are

challenged to analyse these topics impartially, developing well-rounded, informed opinions about the various factors at play and their potential consequences. This process not only deepens their understanding of global issues but also helps them appreciate the intricate interconnectedness of international relations.

The objective of this seminar is to provide a wider intellectual canvas, diplomatic insight and the ability to contribute meaningfully to discussions on the future of global relations, nationally as well as internationally.



## Internship: Ujala Centre

Ujala is a charitable school and vocational training centre dedicated to supporting individuals with differently-abled. Students of Class 10 undertook an enriching internship there, engaging with neurodivergent children and assisting in the development of their academic, vocational and physical skills.

Through daily interactions and weekly workshops, the students gained valuable experience and enhanced their knowledge. They also organised various fundraising events to

support the Centre's ongoing development. The internship culminated in a vibrant fair, hosted by the C.A.S. students for the children, which proved to be a joyous occasion for all involved.

By the end of the programme, our C.A.S. students had developed a strong sense of empathy and compassion. The experience was not only educational but also eye-opening, providing them with a deeper understanding of the challenges faced by individuals with disabilities.



## Internship: Kiran Foundation

Students of Class 10 from The C.A.S. School participated in an internship with the Kiran Foundation, a non-profit organisation based in Lyari. Established in 2006 by Ms Sabina Khatri, the Foundation began as a modest two-room literacy project and has grown into an organisation providing education, mental health support and emotional development for underprivileged children in the community.

Over a two-week internship, the C.A.S. students led interactive workshops aimed at igniting creativity and fostering a love of learning. Activities such as arts and crafts and storytelling captivated the children, creating moments of joy and discovery. The interns also joined the DEAR (Drop Everything and Read) programme, sharing in literary journeys that encouraged the young participants to explore the world of books.

The students extended their contributions by documenting the Foundation's impact through

photography and producing a photojournalism project. Their efforts culminated in a compelling documentary that captured the essence of the Foundation's work and its role in uplifting lives.

This experience provided the interns with valuable insight into the power of compassion and education in transforming communities. It broadened their understanding of social challenges and inspired them to pursue meaningful change in their own lives and beyond.



## Internship: Indus Hospital

Students of Class 10 participated in a two-week internship at the Indus Hospital, Korangi, a well-known non-profit organisation committed to providing free, comprehensive healthcare to underserved communities across Pakistan. Since its founding in 2005, Indus Hospital has remained dedicated to delivering excellence in medical care.

Throughout the two weeks, students gained invaluable hands-on experience and insight into the workings of a hospital environment. Their internship included meaningful interactions and various activities, such as:

- Ward visits:

Students explored different hospital wards, engaging with patients and offering support.



- Rehabilitation experiences:

They met individuals who had received artificial limbs, learning about their recovery journeys and the challenges faced in regaining mobility.

- CPR training:

As part of their first-aid education, the interns attended a CPR workshop, where they learned techniques through a combination of theoretical instruction and practical exercises on mannequins.

These experiences provided the students with a deeper understanding of healthcare, nurturing empathy, compassion and a strong sense of community service.



## Internship: **Indus Yaqeen**

The Indus Yaqeen Youth Volunteer Programme continues to empower students while fostering community service. This year marked the second consecutive year of C.A.S. students participating in this initiative, which ran from 2 September to 28 April.

Students of Class 9 visited the Indus Hospital every Monday, gaining first-hand exposure to healthcare services in a charitable hospital for the under privileged. Their journey began with a hospital tour, lectures on its history, and an introduction to medical procedures.

A highlight of their experience was engaging with young cancer patients through storytelling,

card-making, and creative activities, bringing moments of joy to those undergoing treatment. Students also conducted patient interviews, documenting inspiring health journeys, and visited the rehabilitation clinic to understand the challenges faced by adult patients with artificial limbs. Additionally, they received CPR and fire safety training, equipping them with essential emergency response skills.

The school extends its deepest gratitude to Indus Hospital for this enriching opportunity. As the programme's second year concludes, its impact remains profound, demonstrating that even small acts of kindness can bring about meaningful change.



## Internship: Layton Rahmatulla Benevolent Trust (LRBT)

Students of Class 10 participated in an internship at the Layton Rahmatulla Benevolent Trust (LRBT) Korangi Hospital. Assigned to different departments, including diagnostics, administrative processes and treatment areas, the participants gained firsthand insight into how LRBT provides free eye care services to underserved communities. By interacting with patients, the students deepened their understanding of the critical role healthcare organisations play in addressing public health challenges.

Additionally, they took part in fundraising campaigns to support LRBT's mission to eliminate preventable blindness. Observing the hospital's commitment to marginalised communities left a lasting impact, highlighting the importance of accessible healthcare for all.

The internship was more than just educational; it inspired students to reflect on how their actions and future career aspirations could positively influence society, laying the foundation for future contributions to community welfare.





# Learning Modules




demonstrated a sophisticated grasp of light, shadow, and composition, highlighting each student's artistic growth over the course of the year.

in 2020, 2021, 2022, 2024 and in 2025



The 17th Annual KBC International Interschool Regatta (ISR) took place over the course of an exhilarating week, from 27 January to 2 February. As the most anticipated rowing event of the year, this edition of the ISR was no exception, attracting 500 participants from 38 schools. Adding to the excitement was the participation of teams from Russia and Indonesia, to compete on our waters.

This year, C.A.S. made history by setting new records in the Indoor U-18 boys' category for both the 2x1000m relay (Castro Shahnawaz Sprung and Mikhaal Shahrkh Paracha) and 4x500m relay (Saif Malik, Mikhaal Shahrkh Paracha, Zurain Tahir and Syed Taimoor Ahmer). Additionally, our rowers displayed remarkable skill and strong determination, securing an impressive tally of 11 gold, 13 silver and 1 bronze medal. Kazima Aejaz (Class 10) was nominated The Rower of the Year.



Demonstrating unparalleled consistency and excellence, C.A.S. won the Regatta for the fifth time, winning a total of 179 points.

The 120th Vienna International Rowing Regatta was held on 29 and 30 June, with Pakistan competing in over 20 events in the U-15, U-17, and U-19 categories. Karachi Boat Club fielded a strong contingent, which included 14 students from The C.A.S. School.

Inaaya Jahanaz took part in the U-17 Girls Single Scull (1x), undertaking an on-the-water time trial for the first time. She put up a strong performance, finishing 18th out of 30 in open heats and winning in her final.

The team's achievements were made possible through the guidance of Ms Reem Ansari (Head, Department of Learning Modules) and our rowing coaches, Mr Aneel Shahzad, Mr Umer Allah Rakha, Mr Mubaraz Ashraf, and Mr Arif Ikram (Captain of Boats, KBC). ## Art exhibition Junior Section



# Study trip to Lahore


